I. Program purpose

2. Program contents

● Japanese Language Class (20 units):

We offer 5 different levels of courses: Introductory(), (2), N4, N3, N2

● Special Lectures / Japanese Conversation Class (5 units):

<For N2 and N3 level courses>

5 units of Japanese-conducted special lectures conducted in Japanese on the theme of Japan/Nagasaki.

<For Introductory(),(2),N4 level courses>

5 units (in total) special lectures conducted in English on the theme of Japan/Nagasaki and Japanese conversation practice classes.

- i) Applicants must be enrolled at overseas universities
- ii) Applicants must have an environment to attend the online classes using ZOOM audio and video. (Please attend the course, if possible, using your desk-top PC, lap-top, or tablet.)

Please note that your attendance cannot be counted as "attended" if you attend WITHOUT turning on the camera during the class.

iii) Applicants must have Language Proficiency as below:

To have sufficient Japanese language for the course you wish to take. Also for the Introductory ①, Introductory② and N4 level courses, applicants are required to have English language sufficiency.

iv) Applicants must prepare the designated text book and make sure to have it before the class starts. Please order the text book right after you are accepted to the program.

4. Maximum capacity of the Program: 56 Students

i) Introductory ①:

This course is for those who have never studied Japanese before.

Course material: An original textbook

(You will learn using the Roman alphabet. You do not learn Hiragana, the Japanese alphabet.)

ii) Introductory ②:

This course is for those who can read Hiragana and Katakana but bearly had studied Japanese.

Course material: An original textbook

(You will learn using Hiragana. Participants are required to know how to read/write Hiragana)

iii) N4 Level Course:

This class is for those who have N4 or equivalent level of Japanese Language Proficiency Test.

If there are multiple applicants for one course level, the home university must provides a recommendation order on the Nomination Sheet.
- ii) submit the Certificate of Enrollment (<u>in English</u>), which is issued by the home university, through the online application.
- Nomination Sheet (This sheet should be sent to us by their home university That they are currently enrolled in.)

*The nomination sheet must be submitted by applicant's home university to ryugaku_shien@ml.nagasaki-u.ac.jp no later than May 18th (JST).

The selection result will be informed to the applicant's home university via email by May 26.
